We are finalizing Sunday School plans, but will likely have a once-a-month in-person gathering, followed by at-home-Sunday School for a couple weeks.
- * Confirmation will be held almost entirely online to accommodate for students who may need to quarantine throughout the school year.
- * An adult education class over Zoom is in the works, so people can continue to grow in faith.
- * We will try to keep worship as consistent as possible but may need to make some changes to our worship schedule, depending on the number of volunteers who can assist each week.

Change is often challenging and difficult....and we tend to want it to happen slowly. We have not had that luxury over these past months! We have had to change and adapt quickly to our current situation, as you no doubt have had to do in other areas of your work, school, and family lives. But change—even when challenging—can also bring growth, new perspective, and fresh insight. And God is certainly able to bring growth through the challenges of change here in our congregation.

So in this present moment, I invite and ask you to pray for God's ministry through Zion. Pray for the staff, for your leadership, for the ministries we carry out. Pray for the Holy Spirit's discernment and guidance as we look not only to maintaining ministry but growing and stretching in our vision for the ministry of Zion Lutheran.

Council Highlights - September 2020

- Last year's Confirmation students will be confirmed on Reformation Sunday—October 25th
- AA, GA, and Girl Scouts will be allowed to meet once a week with special requirements in place. Music lessons will be allowed to continue only if they use the fellowship hall.
- Worship discussion Services are dependent upon a certain number of volunteers for sound and ushering these volunteers have been harder to acquire, sound people are also needed for weddings and funerals. There's a possibility of having in -person worship only on certain weekends, with the virtual option occurring on the opposite weekends, if volunteers don't come in.
- An external microphone was purchased for the iPad to help with sound quality when services are recorded.
- Special congregational meeting discussion—
 An amendment is proposed to change the Constitution to allow for electronic congregational meetings and voting.
 The annual meeting may not be able to take place as normal this upcoming year. A resolution was proposed by Council to allow congregational meetings to be held by remote means, including electronically and telephone conference. This special meeting to vote on the resolution proposed will be on October 25th at 9:30 am.

TAKING FAITH HOME

The *Taking Faith Home* sheets will now be available each week inside the front entryway of the church. You can pick up a copy if you attend Sunday worship or anytime during the week.

We'll also include these with Sunday School packets that families will be receiving.

Coming October 4, Adult Sunday school: Food in Scripture and Today.

This will be an online course using video and Google Classroom. There will be links on the homepage for Zion to get into the class. The class can be accessed at any time. We will look at passages on food starting in Genesis, then look at food and the Jewish law, see an erotic application of food in the Song of Solomon, consider meals of the prophet John of locusts and wild honey (what was that all about anyway?), famine versus manutritian in the story of the Prodigal Son, food and the Passover remade into Holy Communion, Jesus' parables of food, like weeds growing with wheat, and eating in paradise. We will cover biblical topics of food as blessing, hospitality and Holy Communion: ethical eating, the poor at our tables; and food and nutrition.

This course will also feature recipes and cooking techniques. We will cover texts written by Galen, a Roman doctor who studied food and nutrition in the second century. This gives a picture of what food was like in the time of Jesus. I also make use of the book by Peter Garnsey, Food and Society in Classical Antiquity. We will look for possibilities in learning how our eating is connected to our following Jesus. I invite you to join this online class. Look for details of how to find the class on our church website.

SPECIAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING

SPECIAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING OCTOBER 25

There will be a special congregation meeting on Sunday, October 25 at 9:30 a.m. The purpose of this meeting will be to act upon recommendation from the Zion Council to amend Zion's Constitution to allow future congregational meetings to include remote participation. All voting members of Zion are encouraged to gather in the north parking lot for this brief meeting (will take 5-10 minutes).

The Zion Council recommends the congregation approve this resolution:

Be it resolved that Zion Lutheran Church amend the Constitution, Bylaws, and Continuing Resolutions to change the number of the current provision C10.08 to C10.09 and to add C10.08 of the Model Constitution for Congregations, stating:


C10.08. This congregation may hold meetings by remote communication, including electronically and by telephone conference, as long as there is an opportunity for simultaneous aural communication. To the extent permitted by state law, notice of all meetings may be provided electronically.

(Provision C10.08 of the current Zion Constitution states: A meeting of the congregation may by majority vote recess to reconvene at a specified time and place. A meeting may also recess to reconvene upon call, provided, however, that the time and place of such a reconvened meeting must be announced at a public service of the congregation, and not less than three days' written notice posted on the church property to be given of the reconvened meeting.)

When people arrive for the meeting on October 25, they will be given a registration form. Voting members will write their names on the form. When it is time to vote, members will exchange their registration form for a ballot to then cast their vote.

Please plan to attend this brief meeting on October 25 to ensure that we can continue carrying out the ministries of Zion Lutheran. Thank you for participating!
