Bible Story: Peter's Dream/An Angel Frees Peter

- 1. Read the Bible story in the Spark Story Bible on pages 526-531.
- 2. Answer the following questions:
 - a. What did Peter dream about?
 - b. Who appeared in Peter's jail cell?
 - c. Where did Peter go after he got out of jail?

The Gentile man believed what Peter told him about Jesus. Peter was right! God wants everyone to learn about Jesus and become part of God's family. God welcomes everyone!

Activity: Giant Board Game

In today's story, something really special happened. Peter was freed from prison, chains, and even guards by an angel of God! Let's see if you can help free Peter from prison today in this great big board game that is set up. You'll have to be careful, though. There are lots of obstacles along the way!

- 1. Create a large, open space where you can play the game (outside might be a good option, too!)
- 2. Use the list below if you forget what happens when you land on each space.
 - Chains (Move back 2 spaces.)
 - Guards (Move back 1 space.)
 - Jail Cell (Move back 1 space.)
 - Doubt (Stay where you are.)
 - Prayer (Move ahead 2 spaces.)
 - Angel (Move ahead 2 spaces.)
 - Miracle (Move ahead 3 spaces.)
 - Friends (Move ahead 1 space.)
 - Peter is in prison. Oh, no! (Start)
 - Peter is free! Hurray! (Finish)
- 3. Spread out the printed game board spaces on the floor around the room.
- 4. Add one or two blank half sheets of paper between each printed sheet.
- 5. Tape the game board spaces in place with masking tape (or if you're outside, put a rock on them)
- 6. Cut out the cube template around the outside edge. Fold along each line; tape or glue the cube together.

- 7. Take turns rolling the number cube; move along the game board path. Follow any instructions if you land on a space that has writing; if it's blank, stay where you are.
- 8. Play until someone reaches the finish and sets Peter free from prison.
