#### **IN-BETWEEN TIME**

In the church, we often talk about living in an "in between time". We are in between the time when Christ ascended to heaven and a future time when Christ will return again, when all things will be put right and sin and death and dying will be no more. This is a promise God has given to us. Sin, death, and evil are very present realities. But one day, they will no longer be. In the meantime, though, we live in a kind of holy waiting time, an interim time, when we are at work in the world, continuing to proclaim God's unconditional love and mercy, and also living into the hope of all that God has promised is in store for us.

Debie Thomas wrote about interim time a couple years ago in *The Christian Century*:

Though the life of faith is often described in terms of joyful arrivals and culminations, in reality we spend a lot of our time in between. Though we know that Good Friday gives way to Easter, we live our lives on Holy Saturday, waiting for the fullness of resurrection's promise to unfold. Sometimes it feels as if the whole planet is straining with impatience, yearning for something better. Sometimes I wonder if in-betweenness is the quintessential human condition. As a church, we are experiencing a kind of in-between time right now, between the usual patterns of our congregational life together as we experienced them before the pandemic and what those patterns will look like once all of our pandemic concerns have finally eased. Even though it sounds like kind of a contradiction, this is an active waiting time. And during this time, we continue to have an opportunity to experiment with new things.

One thing we're "trying out" during the Easter season is a Wednesday evening service. The praise band has been leading music for our midweek evening services during Lent, and they will continue to lead at a Wednesday contemporary service in April and May. This will still be a shorter service—about 35 minutes long. The worship time will shift to 6:15 p.m. and the Zion women/fellowship group will continue providing grab-n-go meals after worship.

This gives us a chance to gauge if there is continued interest in and need for a Wednesday evening service. At the end of the May, our worship committee and council plan to evaluate to determine if the midweek service should continue or not. Of course, our Sunday morning traditional service at 8:30 will continue during this time as well.



Here are some of the super fun things we experienced in March!!





#### FROM THE BISHOP'S DESK

Siblings in Christ of the South Dakota Synod,

Faith is to hope for things that are yet unseen. South Dakota Synod, we will not need to "go back to normal", we will not even try to find a "new normal". But we will boldly live into God's future by continuing to show up proclaiming the good news of Jesus, the Christ. Alleluia!
