PRAISE GOD FROM WHOM ALL BLESSINGS FLOW

I like to think I'm pretty good at giving thanks and praise to God. Well, I'm good at it in church, anyway... as long as it happens through our responsive reading of the psalms. Maybe you recognize that in yourself, too. It's harder for us to praise God once we get back to our lives outside of the church building.

Taking praise out of the church and into our everyday lives affects the way we see God at work in the world. Praise reorients us to see God's action in our lives. It attunes us to God's very real presence with us and acknowledges that God actually cares to get involved in the world on our behalf. We can see this happening in Psalm 103 where the psalmist names ways that God intervenes in human lives, both on a tangible, physical level and on a spiritual level:

Bless the Lord, O my soul,

and do not forget all his benefits-

who forgives all your iniquity,

who heals all your diseases,

who redeems your life from the Pit,

who crowns you with steadfast love and mercy,

who satisfies you with good as long as you live

so that your youth is renewed like the eagle's.

We use psalms in our worship services, and we can certainly use those same psalms as our own personal prayers of praise. But there are other ways that we can make the language of the praise psalms our language in everyday life. We are often quick to say "Congratulations!" to people when we witness blessing in their lives. But we're hesitant to say "Praise God" in the same situations. So, this week, try doing just that. If you witness a blessing in someone's life—a marriage, a new job, a graduation—try giving praise to God for that blessing. Yeah, it feels a little awkward. But we're Lutherans, so you can always fall back on those familiar words, "Thanks be to God!"

We can also help each other as a community of faith to cultivate this pattern of praise. We're all used to calling the church and adding our names or the names of people we care about to the prayer list in times of need. We lift those needs in prayer during worship, as we should. But we don't often invite you to let us know when you have something to *praise* God for.

So, we've set up a bulletin board in the fellowship hall. During the month of July, I invite you to write down the things you want to praise God for and pin your praises to the board. Add your name or keep it confidential—it's up to you. But share when and how God blesses you (or someone you love), cares for you, rescues you from danger, heals you from illness, provides something you need, delivers you, sustains you, and forgives you. We'll make room in our prayers of the people to praise God for those blessings. And I hope you will make room in your conversations with one another to say "Thanks be to God!" for those blessings, too.

Council Highlights June 2021

The Youth Committee asked the Zion Council to approve the removal of the north wall in the youth room and to match 1:1 the project costs. The council approved both requests.

The first day of VBS was held on June 1st, with 25 total attendees. Another day of VBS will be held on Tuesday, July 13th at 5:45 pm with another possible day to be held in August.

The council discussed and ultimately voted to lift all Covid restrictions and "return to normal"; masks and social distancing are still encouraged for those not vaccinated or with compromised immune systems.

Discussion was held about adding back the 10:45 am contemporary worship service on Sunday mornings starting in September while deciding to keep or let go of (for now) the Wednesday evening service. Final decisions will be made by Worship and Music committee members and council members in July.

COVID RESPONSE UPDATE

In May, the Zion council decided to relax most of our Covid restrictions, and it has been so good to enjoy this new reality for the life of our congregation! It's been wonderful to see and visit with one another without masks on, to have Communion in the "normal" way again, and to be able to share in fellowship over coffee and snacks (we're just getting started with that!).

With vaccination rates continuing to rise and case levels falling to where they were in April of 2020, things look good for being able to continue returning to pre-pandemic congregational life. There will be a couple of changes that may be here to stay (livestreamed worship is one!), but those changes will be good for our church life rather than obstacles.

Here's a reminder of what the council decided at their May meeting:

- * Masks will now be optional for all indoor activities, including worship services.
- * We will not require social distancing in the whole sanctuary but will still provide a section of pews where people who choose to can space further from others.
- * Indoor fellowship time with beverages and food can resume. We'll still have a limited number of tables and chairs at each table in the fellowship hall for the time being.

At their June meeting, council decided on a few more changes:

- * We will no longer have a social distancing section of the sanctuary.
- * Funeral lunches can resume in the fellowship hall.
- * All seating capacities are lifted.

COVID-19

Please continue keep in mind that children under 12 cannot yet be vaccinated. Unvaccinated adults, those who are immunocompromised, and children are encouraged to continue wearing masks.

SPECIAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING



Thank you to all who attended the special congregational meeting on June 6! At this meeting, the congregation voted by written ballot to approve all the needed organ repairs (as presented by the JF Nordlie Company), to finance the repairs of \$250,000, and to conduct a capital campaign to pay for the repairs. The criteria for the financing through Dacotah Bank are that we must have 20% up front (\$50,000) and pledges for the remainder of the project in full (\$200,000). Repairs will not begin until we have met these criteria. For the capital campaign, donors will be able to complete their pledges over a three-year period.



Pipe Organ Renovation Project Update

On June 6, Zion members approved a renovation plan to make the much needed repairs and improvements to our pipe organ. This plan was prepared by J.F. Nordlie Company of Sioux Falls who has provided routine maintenance for many years and is well acquainted with the current condition of our instrument. Their quote for the project is \$250,000, but no work can or will begin until \$50,000, or 20% of the cost, has been raised and paid as a first installment, and we have received pledges to cover the balance. If you have questions about the scope of this project, we encourage you to watch a brief video prepared by Nordlie that fully explains what they are proposing. It can be found on Zion's webpage.

Although this is a daunting project, it provides us with the opportunity to assure a quality organ will be available for future generations to enjoy during worship, weddings, and/or celebrations of life. We've supported other high-cost projects, worked together to raise funds, and successfully completed the work. Let's come together again, embrace the organ's needs, and return it to its glory.

Of course, there will be a pledge drive, so all members can contribute whatever comfortably fits into their budget over a multi-year period. Every gift is important, no matter its size. But there will also be fundraisers of all types planned for us to enjoy food and fellowship to benefit the organ.

There are many ways to support this project other than with your dollars. Your time and talents are also vital to the project's success. Fundraising ideas have been shared and are being considered. If you have event ideas or are willing to help with an event, please contact the Organ Committee. Together we can have some fun while raising the necessary dollars to begin and ultimately complete the project.

To start the process, we will be selling rolls (caramel and cinnamon) on Sunday, July 25.

SYNOD CONNECTIONS

2021 South Dakota Synod Assembly

The Thirty-Third South Dakota Synod Assembly convened virtually under the theme of "Journeying Together in Christ with our Neighbors in Solidarity" on June 4-5, 2021. This was the first South Dakota Synod Assembly to be held in a virtual meeting setting and the first time the synod assembly has gathered since 2019. The 2020 Synod Assembly was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The Synod Assembly is the highest legislative body of the South Dakota Synod that is composed of both lay members and rostered ministers.



Over the course of two days, voting members took action on many items presented before the assembly:

Elected Dennis Thompson (Calvary, Rapid City) to a four-year term as vice president.

Re-Elected Rev. Jonathan Vehar (Peace, Sioux Falls) to a four-year term as secretary.

Elected Terry Johnson (Gloria Dei, Sioux Falls) to a four-year term as treasurer.

Adopted a resolution to elect South Dakota Synod Council Members.

Adopted a resolution for 2022 Compensation and Guidelines for Rostered Ministers and Lay Staff.

Adopted a resolution on Expanding Health Coverage to the Poor in South Dakota.

Adopted a resolution to elect 2022 ELCA Churchwide Assembly Voting Members.

Adopted a resolution to support ELCA World Hunger Efforts.

Adopted a resolution for the South Dakota Synod leadership to model a land acknowledgment and invite other South Dakota ministries to do the same.

Adopted a resolution recognizing the leadership of Dr. Carla Borchardt.

Adopted a resolution to adopt certain amendments to the constitution of the South Dakota Synod.

Adopted a resolution to ratify the election of Synod Council Members elected by the Synod Council.

Approved the 2022 Mission Plan.

Passed a unanimous ballot for certain committee and board elections.

In addition to the business presented before the assembly, members heard keynote presentations by Willette Capers under the theme of "Won't you be my Neighbor: Embracing Difference While Creating Belonging." Willette Capers serves Augustana University as the Assistant Dean of Students for Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion. Rev. Amy Reumann, ELCA Senior Director for Witnessing in Society, presented the State of the ELCA and brought greetings from the Presiding Bishop, Rev. Elizabeth Eaton. Bishop Constanze Hagmaier, along with her associates, Rev. Renee Splichal Larson and Rev. Jonathan Steiner, also gave addresses to the assembly.

Final resolutions with amendments and minutes of the synod assembly will be posted online when made available.
