



Work to Be Completed


- Bid from JF Nordlie
 - Replace electrical and control system
 - Refurbish the pipes and winding components
 - Façade addition,casework and pipere-organization
 - -Console rejuvenation



Exterior of Organ

- Create protection for the organ
- Create easier access for tuning and maintenance
 - Less danger of someone falling over the half wall.
- New façade
 - Polished aluminum





Pipe body

Individual Pipes

Toe

Attaches to the wind chest so no leaks of wind

Languid

• Wind passes from the toe, over the lower lip of the bottom of the pipe and the languid which is the piece that kind of looks like a tape dispenser, it creates a soundwave.


Pipe body

• That sound wave travels up the pipe body and the length of the pipe body gives you the note the organist is playing.

Individual Pipe Issues

- In some of our pipes, the languid has begun to sag
 - Happens over time
 - Sags too much, will not create a proper sound.
- What they must do
 - Take all pipes back to Sioux Falls
 - Take a rod up to where the languid is sagging, and gently correct the sagging.



Wind Regulator


- Leathers on hinges in the reservoirs.
 - Wear and tear have caused severe damage and need replaced.
 - Not replaced leads to damage in the board



Valves



- Valves below the pipes prevent air from going into the wrong pipes causing wrong notes.
- Valves are made by a strip of wood surfaced with a high density felt and covered with goat's leather.
 - -Leather and felt are attached by glue
 - Current valves have glue that is failing
 - Those valves are going to be replaced.



Control System Upgrade

- Computer in the console connect to the pipe organ by fiberoptic cable.
 - Individualized key memory
 - -Input a transposer
 - Rebuild the console
 - New tilting tablets
 - Refinish the exterior of the console
 - New LED display to display memory level
 - New peddle keys
 - -Add an adjustable bench

Interior Control System Before

- Cotton wrapped and waxed wire.
 - Good technology at the time but now is against fire code
- Oxidized and corrodes over time
- Soldered joints are beginning to fail
 - Used rose core that over time broke down the sawder
 - Soon could cause sparks










- Updates the technology



- 1. Lengthen the platform so the piano can move over
- 2. Look into alternative for laptop and sound board tables
- Cable management as the tables are going to be altered in some way

Cost Analysis

- The Big Ticket
 - •\$250,000
 - Payments to the organ company:
 - 1. 15% (\$37,500) down payment to start
 - 2. 15% 30 days later
 - 3. 60% in monthly installments
 - a. \$30,000 for 6 months
 - 4. 10% upon completion

To Get Started

- 1. Approval from congregation at special congregational meeting on June 6th at 9:45am
- 2. Pledges and funds raised must meet loan amount
- 3. 20% of project (\$50,000) needs to be raised prior to signing loan documents
- 4. Work can begin once we've achieved both marks

Pledges

- We are going to ask the congregation for pledges over the next three months
 - June, July, August

Fundraising

- Our committee is currently looking into all fundraising opportunities in and outside of our congregation.
 - We are fully aware of financial strains our economy and congregation
 - Looking at individual pipe donation/naming
 - Engraving on the pipe as well as a plaque at the bottom of the stairs
 - Concert opportunities
 - Hoping to tap connections with local organizations and college opportunities to host opportunities for concerts
 - Meals
 - German fest and events like that
