A lot has happened since June. We voted to begin our Organ Restoration capital campaign on June 6, and Pastor Erin resigned June 29 for a new call in Nebraska, leaving us on July 31. I want to give a huge THANK YOU to our staff Donna, Saundra, Sonya, Sue, Stephanie, Art, and Jami - you have all been instrumental to keeping things on track ever so flawlessly through the change and the stress. Zion appreciates you!

Thank you to our worship assistants and all of our volunteers! We would not be able to provide worship, communion, sound, and Power Point without volunteers. We need a few to join the rotation for our fall worship services, so if interested, please let us know!

For August and September Sunday worship, I used a list the Synod provides to find 'Pulpit Supply' for all of the Sundays. There sure aren't many in our region, and unfortunately, due to busy summer schedules, many people were already scheduled elsewhere. Through the many calls I made, we were able to cover all of the Sundays through September, with two coming from three hours away. I will begin working on October, but I am hoping I will not need to continue to piece months together for very long.

Our council is made up of Zion members with a wide range of experience- from first-timers who were invited to join and never would have considered serving because they weren't asked, to others who have experience on council at one time or another during their tenure at Zion. I was not a member at Zion when Pastor Erin was called, and I also was not here for the last capital campaign; I am very appreciative and thankful for the council members AND those of you who have reached out to give me advice, tell me questions I should ask, or just do a quick check in. It is <u>crucial</u> that if you have something to say or add to our conversations that you reach out to a council member to share. There will be no judgement or argument, and we do not do anonymity; parking lot conversations must be a thing of the past. YOUR VOICE is so very important—please know that. The Executive Committee's phone numbers are listed in the bulletin; please reach out.

As a congregation we need to look at the whole picture—where are we at, and where do we want to go?

How long are we able to sustain without growth of our congregation?

How do we agree on a vision, and what has to give? How can we work on our communication with one another?

The Synod provided a ministry profile of a potential interim pastoral candidate; his name is Mark Galbraith, and he currently resides in California. He has 30 years of ministry with 13 of those being an intentional interim around the country. His expertise fit in line with the questions above, and I had an initial phone meeting with him on Friday, Aug. 13. For the first time in a month, I did not feel worried about the path we are on. The Executive Committee read the profile and discussed my meeting with him on Sunday, Aug. 15 after worship. We had Pastor Mark meet with the council on Tuesday, Aug. 17 via Zoom. We spent the next couple days discussing via email, and Ed contacted the Synod with more questions. After a motion and second were made, I asked for a vote on Sunday, Aug. 22. We had a quorum - 12 yes and 1 no vote- so the Executive Committee will proceed with negotiating a one-year contract with Pastor Mark, with the Synod's help. If he agrees and joins us, and if Zion or Pastor Mark decide it is not working, either party can cancel the contract with a 30 day notice.

Please join us for Fall Kickoff on Sunday, Sept. 12th. We will have Common Grounds (informal forum) during fellowship after the first worship service, where your questions and open conversation are very much welcome. I am hoping we have a wonderful turn out for all of the day's activities, and look forward to everyone coming together for some fun! It has been too long, and I have certainly missed gathering together!






Church on the Street




