that shall never be destroyed.

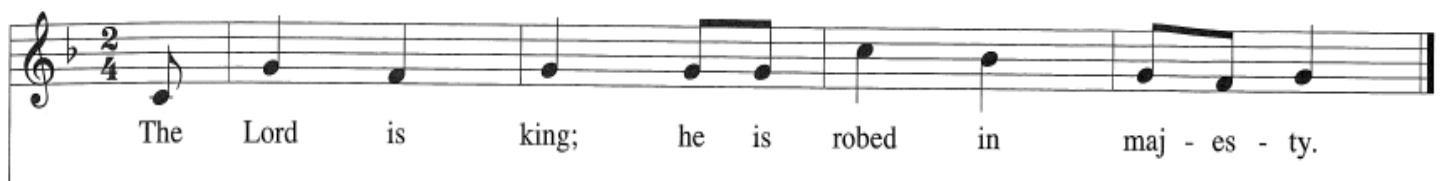

So it is to be. Amen.

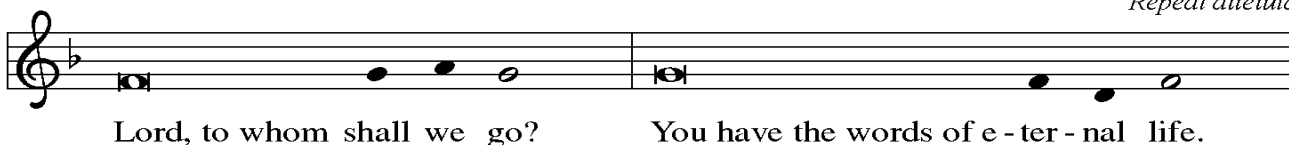
