God's Beloved People:

Don't you just love it? ...the lights adorning homes, parks, businesses, downtowns, living rooms, the traditions; also the homecomings, festive gatherings and family traditions, the music...oh the music....hymns, carols, concerts, stage shows....! That is probably my favorite part of this holiday season. The giving, receiving and sharing. We are in a weeks-long preparation and celebration of the King of Kings and Lord of Lords! I'm totally good with increasingly singing carols and hymns during the season of Advent, as part of the preparation. Why not? Let's enjoy all aspects of this most blessed seasons in all its fullness.

The Reason for the Season speaks for itself. I found this reading, from Frederic Buechner, reproduced here, in part, for your reflection during this month:

"The lovely old carols played and replayed till their effect is like a dentist's drill or a jackhammer, the bathetic banalities of the pulpit and the chilling commercialism of almost everything else, people spending money they can't afford on presents you neither need nor want, "Rudolph, the Red-Nosed Reindeer," the plastic tree, the cornball creche, the Hallmark Virgin. Yet for all our efforts, we've never quite managed to ruin it. That in itself is part of the miracle, a part you can see. Most of the miracle you can't see, or don't.

The young clergyman and his wife do all the things you do on Christmas Eve. They string the lights and hang the ornaments. They supervise the hanging of the stockings. They tuck in the children. They lug the presents down out of hiding and pile them under the tree. Just as they're about to fall exhausted into bed, the husband remembers his neighbor's sheep. The man asked him to feed them for him while he was away, and in the press of other matters that night he forgot all about them. So down the hill he goes through knee-deep snow. He gets two bales of hay from the barn and carries them out to the shed. There's a forty-watt bulb hanging by its cord from the low roof, and he turns it on. The sheep huddle in a corner watching as he snaps the baling twine, shakes the squares of hay apart, and starts scattering it. Then they come bumbling and shoving to get at it with their foolish, mild faces, the puffs of their breath showing in the air. He is reaching to turn off the bulb and leave when suddenly he realizes where he is. The winter darkness. The glimmer of light. The smell of the hay and the sound of the animals eating. Where he is, of course, is the manger (and I, Pastor Mark, might add, mangers were, according to recent discoveries, e.g. by Dr. Ken Bailey, part of typical middle eastern homes in that part of the world, then and now.)

He only just saw it. He whose business it is above everything else to have an eye for such things is all but blind in that eye. He who on his best days believes that everything that is most precious anywhere comes from that manger might easily have gone home to bed never knowing that he had himself just been in the manger. The world is the manger. It is only by grace that he happens to see this other part of the miracle.

Christmas itself is by grace. It could never have survived our own blindness and depredations otherwise. It could never have happened otherwise. Perhaps it is the very wildness and strangeness of the grace that has led us to try to tame it. We have tried to make it habitable. We have roofed it in and furnished it. We have reduced it to an occasion we feel at home with, at best a touching and beautiful occasion, at worst a trite and cloying one....

Prior to Covid, council had been discussing combining some of the committees to restructure the council. Currently council is set up with 11 committees equaling 14 voting members. After prayerful consideration we completed our discussion at our meeting on Tuesday 11/16. Here is the recommendation we would like to vote on at the annual meeting. Bylaws would be updated accordingly, should the restructuring pass.

Our new model would decrease our committees to six and voting members to 9.

Executive Committee: no changes to be made, four council members represent this committee- President, Vice

President, Secretary, Treasurer

Worship & Music Committee: no changes to be made

Mission & Outreach Committee: Council moves to rename from Social Concerns

The following committees will include sub-committees, but only the council chair will be responsible for attending council:

Faith Formation Committee: Council moves to rename from Education. This committee would combine Education and Youth and will include Youth, Family, Adult and Christian education teams.

Welcome & Caring Committee: Council moves to rename from Welcome & Outreach. This committee would combine Welcome & Outreach, Fellowship and Visitation.

Finance & Stewardship Committee: Council moves to rename from Finance. This committee would combine Finance, Stewardship, and Properties.

The annual meeting is <u>Sunday</u>, <u>January 30th</u>. At this time we will recap our year, vote on the 2022 operating budget, and vote on these changes along with any other agenda items.




the children were super excited to take them

Trunk or Treat


