Happy New Year 2022.

I hope your holidays were festive, filling and fulfilling. May the Christ Child, whose birth we celebrated once again, continue to be sought for in the mangers of the hearts of all God's people as we do mission and ministry together.

2022 shapes up to be a very pivotal year for the future of Zion Lutheran Church. We are entering into the second phase of the discernment and transition season, I call the "Mission Study and Mission Goal Process. The goal is that through these small groups, Mission Goals will surface that will inform everything to happen in the next chapter of ZLC's ministry, including who to call as Lead Pastor. The projected timeline is as follows (in bullet-point format):

- January 2022 Training for Mission Study Small Groups
 - **January 16** Between services in the Fellowship Hall Power Point presentation on The Timeline: Phases II and III
- February -March 2022 Mission Study Groups meet, either in homes or on campus
- **April-May 2022** Review of Small Group responses by Council and Group Leaders, towards preparation of PowerPoint summary

Council can begin nomination of Call Committee process, not before, as I want everyone participation and prayers to be focused on the Small Groups

- May 22, 2022 (or before) PowerPoint Presentation and Summary of Mission Study Small Groups
- **June-Sept. 2022** Call Committee works with Pr. Renee of the South Dakota Synod-ELCA in preparation of the Ministry Site Profile (MSP)
- Sept. 2022- ????? 2023 Phase III The Interview Phase is launched

Some things to keep in mind:

Every interim setting is different, and this process and projected (and I stress projected) timeline takes on a life of its own. It may be shorter than we think to our pleasant surprise, or it will take longer than we wish.

The interview stage is all dependent on the given # of candidates at any given time, and who are a potential match for the Mission Goals of ZLC.

Pastors are in mobility year-round, so do not fret about missing the "strike-while-the-iron-is-hot" times (Spring-fall).

The Interview Phases lasts typically several-12 months or more, depending on matching candidates available and successful interviews.

- Council looked at and approved the proposed 2022 budget. This budget will be available for review in the annual reports; these will be ready toward the latter part of January.


