God's beloved People of Zion Lutheran Church:

By the time you read this, I will be settled into my new call here in SoCal. Thank you, again for all your expressions of support, prayers, and well-wishes. It was truly my joy and pleasure to serve with you as Interim Pastor. As I said in my letter, I believe Zion is well-positioned to soon complete all the necessary tasks in the interim season to begin interviews with well-qualified candidates for Lead Pastor. I am proud that we completed the core interim work together, including the Mission Study. As an exciting development, a contract with Lutheran Campus Ministry, to rent office space here at Zion, and have a home-base for ministry to the campus community, is in process. What an exciting partnership this will be for both Zion and LCM.

As a friendly reminder of next steps you can anticipate:

- The Bishop's Office is in conversation with Zion Council about pulpit supply and possible continued interim pastoral coverage.
- Your council is now busy with nominating and appointing a call committee. Call committees are usually 5 to 7
 people, comprised of a balance of men and women, a variety of ages and representation from the
 congregation.
- Upon appointment of the call committee, they will begin to fill out the Ministry Site Profile, per the Synodical Call Process Manuel. When that is completed, Pastor Renee will come to Zion to do a mission study site visit. She will meet with the congregation and walk through the draft of the MSP, through those eyes of a potential candidate, ask questions, and give feedback as if she were a candidate. The congregation will also have a chance to have input in the final crafting of the MSP, affirming "yes this is what sounds like us", or "no this is not who we are". If further work need to be done on the MSP, it will be given to the Call Committee for any revisions and changes.
- Upon approval of the final draft of the MSP by both the council and the Bishop's office, it will be released nationally on the database, for candidates to read and consider if the Holy Spirit is leading whether or not to be interviewed.
- The Ministry Site Profile is going to be the first impression that candidates will get of Zion Lutheran Church, so it is highly important that the call committee has the best and most capable representation of Zion members who will do this task with purpose and excellence, so as to present a true, honest, and authentic portrayal of Zion Lutheran Church, its strengths and challenges, and most importantly Mission Goals.
- The ministry site profile is going to be Zion Lutheran Church's résumé, so make it count, stand out, and sing! This is what will set the table for the entire interview process towards the calling of Zion's next Lead Pastor.

Be in continual and serious prayer and continued listening to God and each other. As we all are in the Season of Pentecost, trust and rest that God's Ever-Active Presence, The Holy Spirit, is guiding this process.

Remember, no time is wasted time during this season of interim ministry and transition. You will learn so much about yourself, each other, and God. God's got this! Because God's got you, the great and holy people of Zion Lutheran Church!




Noisy Offering





Update from our Council President

Hello to you all as we find spring weather and begin school summer break! I am writing to touch base with information.

Thursday, May 5, Pastor Mark submitted his resignation to both the Synod and Zion Church Council, and he shared the news on Sunday, May 8. As stated in the contract council signed with him, <u>either party</u> could cancel the one year contract with a 30 day notice if something changed or it was not working out. In Mark's case, he was called to another congregation who could utilize his services during their transition. We thank him for his time with us and wish him all the best in future adventures!

While his time in Aberdeen has been cut short, Zion is sitting in a better position than we were prior to his arrival. What I want the congregation to know is that we INVESTED in Mark to guide us through our transition and we DID receive our return on our investment we were hoping for: his site study PowerPoint after the small group sessions. Both council leadership and congregation/future call committee are now well equipped to fill out the Ministry Site Profile, have a visit from Pastor Renee at the Synod, and begin our search for a lead Pastor. Council will vote on the Call Committee and we will begin the filling out the MSP very soon!

We must pivot to make necessary adjustments, as we have now for the last year. It is not easy and to set the record straight, I am in frequent communication with Pastor Renee at the Synod regarding our situation and potential pulpit supply/interims that would be available on such short notice to help us as we transition to summer worship.

I must say that I am disheartened to hear that gossip/parking lot conversations are still going. No one is calling me directly to inquire, but many are continuing to fuel the fire. It's extremely discouraging. As it is written in Ephesians 4:29 "Do not let any unwholesome talk come out of your mouths, but only what is helpful for building others up according to their needs, that it may benefit those who listen." Please, let's focus on building each other up and supporting the ministry and work of our staff and committees.

As a reminder, Council meetings are held on the third Tuesday of every month at 6:30pm and are open for all to attend. If you have concerns or questions, please feel free to join us. We are <u>volunteers</u> you have elected to this council and there is not a handbook on how to handle every situation. If you have an idea, thought, concern or something to share with us, please join our meeting or reach out via phone!
