

Meet Pastor Jim Holthus

I am excited to begin as the part-time interim pastor at Zion Lutheran Church. I'm also excited to share that, thanks to Joel Albrecht who showed me this house for rent in his neighborhood, I now have a place to live in Aberdeen on SE 13^{th} Ave.

I grew up on a farm between Woonsocket and Wessington Springs and graduated from Lane High School. (Anybody remember the Rainbow Ballroom in Lane?) My brother David still lives and farms there. I attended Northern State "College" from 1968-1972 and graduated with a B.S. in Ed. I worked at the old YMCA at 420 S. Lincoln and began as



a "cage worker", then a lifeguard and the Aquatic Director, and finally the Youth Director. While attending Luther Seminary in St Paul I returned in the summers of 1976 and 1977 to be the YMCA Camp Wisagoma Director. (My junior and senior high pastor at our church in Wessington Springs was Pastor Ken Thurow, who had moved here to serve Zion in the 70's; he asked me to preach for him once during the summer of 1977 while he was on vacation, so I can honestly say I was up front leading worship at Zion once 45 years ago!)

I've served parishes in Hawley, MN and Perley, MN. I've been the Lutheran Campus Pastor at U of Wisconsin-Oshkosh, Bemidji State College in Bemidji, and Omaha metro colleges and universities. I got a Masters of Ed. in Clinical Counseling from North Dakota State U in 1993 and worked as a counselor at Lutheran Social Services in Moorhead for a couple of years.

Since retiring and moving to Omaha I've served part-time interim pastorates at the American Lutheran Church in Ashland, Trinity Lutheran Church and Bethel Lutheran Church and Immanuel Lutheran Church in the Omaha metro.

My tentative moving schedule is to drive the U-Haul the 400 miles from Omaha to Aberdeen on Wednesday, August 31 so everything can be unloaded to the house and church office before Labor Day weekend.



I enjoy people, preaching, telling stories, giving feedback when asked, occasionally putting my "counselor hat" on, asking "Why do we do this?", working with youth and young adults, leading Bible studies, visiting shut-ins and less mobile people, and being an obedient human servant to my two ten-year old felines. I enjoy all kinds of table games, trivia contests, and listening to my collection of vinyl albums from the 60's and 70's (I intend to install my working turntable in my office and have the entire music collection available to play.)

You'll see me riding my electrical bicycle to church a lot as I have owned it for 16 months and have about 850 miles on it so far.

Thank you for this opportunity to be a partner in ministry with Zion Lutheran, to hang out in my old college town, and to be closer to my brother on the family farm.

August Council Highlights

- Pastor Jim (PJ) has signed a contract. We are awaiting Synod approval. His first Sunday will be September 11th.
- The Education Committee is working on refreshing all the classrooms upstairs for the start of the new school year.
- A motion was made by the Preschool Committee and approved by Council to increase preschool tuition prices effective for the next school year (2023-2024).
- The Worship and Music Committee proposed 9 AM church service, followed by Sunday School and Coffee / Fellowship. This would be effective Sunday, 9/11 through the annual meeting in January when the congregation will vote to extend or end this schedule. Council approved this motion.

Special Offering for September Is Safe Harbor

Originally formed in 1977, Safe Harbor began as a volunteer phone service providing information to women. Soon it was evident the community needed more than just a source of information, especially for people in need of shelter in a crisis situation.

Today, Safe Harbor serves adults and children by providing shelter and resources for making positive life choices. Their mission is to empower individuals in abusive situations by providing advocacy and support services; to educate and motivate the community to be proactive in eliminating abuse.

While they are based in Aberdeen, they serve seven counties in northeastern SD including Brown, Campbell, Day, Edmunds, Marshall, McPherson and Potter.








Hay Rides and Fall Vibes Event
