ADVENT Sunday worship theme: "OPEN". I will be preaching on this word during three of the Sundays of Advent—December 18 will be the Sunday School Christmas program so there will be no sermon that day. This is a quote from a person who lived in the 4th century that was the inspiration for this series: "Do not allow anything that might disturb—to enter upon our watch. Let the path of the ear be cleared; let the light of the eye be chastened; let the contemplation of the heart be sanctified; let the speech of the mouth be purified."

Sunday, November 27—Open our EYES. Focus verse: Luke 2:30 "My eyes have seen your salvation which you have prepared in the sight of all people."

Sunday, December 4—Open our EARS. Focus verse: Isaiah 55:3 "Incline your ear and come to me; listen, so that you might live."

Sunday, December 11—Open our HEARTS. Focus verse: 2 Thessalonians 3:5 "May the Lord direct your hearts to the love of God."

Sunday, December 18—Sunday School Christmas program at 10:00 a.m. and NO regular worship service at 9:00 a.m.

ADVENT mid-week worship "Reader's Theater" on the meaning of Advent

Join us for supper starting Wednesday November 30 from 5:15-6:00 p.m. in the fellowship hall and then be part of our mid-week worship starting at 6:05 p.m. We will worship on Wednesdays November 30 and December 7 and 14. We will NOT have midweek worship on December 21 to allow families to finish last-minute tasks so we have nothing scheduled at church for that night.

We will be using Holden Evening Prayer for our worship liturgy. Instead of sermons we will watch three people each week perform in a "Reader's Theater" about the meaning of Advent, discussing Jesus as a babe born at Christmas, how Jesus comes to the poor and suffering in the present, and how Jesus will one day return as King. Each character will read a short Scripture and attempt to interpret it while the other two characters offer feedback and advice. Be prepared for puns!

Below are some helpful terms that you will hear throughout this upcoming Advent and Christmas season:

ADVENT TERMS

ADVENT is a Latin word meaning "a coming or arrival" and refers to the coming of the Lord. The Advent season begins the new liturgical church year on the fourth Sunday before Christmas.

IMMANUEL is a Hebrew word meaning "God is with us." Isaiah, the Old Testament prophet, recorded the Lord's promise that he would come to us to rule with peace and justice. In Jesus, God came to live with us.

REPENT! Is the cry of John the Baptizer and the Old Testament prophets that came before him, calling the Lord's people, then and now, to change their hearts and live in preparation for meeting their God.

SON OF DAVID is the title for a long-awaited descendant of the great Old Testament Jewish king, David. This descendant would be chosen from King David's family & town (Bethlehem) by the Lord God to lead his people.

MESSIAH is the Hebrew title meaning "anointed one" or "chosen one", like the Greek word "Christ."

MARANATHA is an Aramaic word (the language Jesus spoke) meaning "Come, Lord!" Early Christians included this exclamation in their worship, expressing their belief, and ours, that Jesus who came once as a child will return as Christ the King and Lord of the universe.


