and the young will fall exhausted;

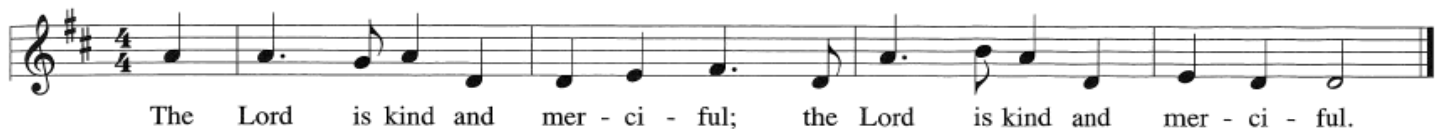
³¹but those who wait for the LORD shall renew their strength,
