#### Lent

The word **Lent** comes from two older words that mean **spring season** and **lengthen** (since the days are getting longer.) It starts on Ash Wednesday, which this year is on Wednesday, February 22 and is completed during Holy Week on Maundy Thursday or Good Friday. This season in the church year is basically a call to take Jesus more seriously than we usually do; it is a time to reflect on our life and God's call to us to live as Christians. There are three primary things to focus on during this season: prayer, fasting, and sharing/stewardship. All Christians are asked/expected to find a way to include these things in their own lives during this season.

Here are some opportunities for you to try:

#### **Lenten Behaviors**


- Read one chapter of the Bible each day
- Pray intentionally for five minutes every day
- Donate up to 10% of your income
- Volunteer an hour a week in service
- Each week, write or call one person who has touched your life in a positive way
- Visit a nursing home & help out
- Find a prayer partner and pray with them
- Put other people first for an hour each day
- Keep a prayer journal
- Give away clothes you don't need or wear or linens, furniture, utensils, jewelry
- Stop doing a negative habit and replace it with a positive behavior instead

#### **Midweek Lenten Worship Services**

Midweek Worship Schedule on Wednesday nights will focus on <u>Luther's Small Catechism</u>. This is what the confirmation class/Bible study has been focusing on for their studies on Wednesday evenings through January. This is a positive way for us to remember and reflect on how much we need to keep this small booklet close to us and review it regularly.

Pastor Jim will be offering a Bible study on Thursdays over the lunch hour during Lent; the first one will start February 23. 


#### **Summer Camp Registration**
