From the Desk of Pastor Jim

Make sure you take a look at our "Time and Talents Survey" elsewhere in this newsletter. This year we are focusing on stewardship and giving back to God our treasure, our time, and our talents. Here is 1 Peter 4:10: "As each has received a gift, use it to serve one another, as good stewards of God's varied grace." If we believe this verse, then we begin to realize that EACH of us is gifted in some way—musically, athletically, strong leadership skills, an encouragement to others, financially, etc. Perhaps you know someone who is very charismatic and able to inspire others or convince people to be better in some way. Here's my point: in the Greek language of the New Testament, the word *gift* is the Greek word "charisma". We are all charismatic—gifted by the Holy Spirit—but not so we can only use our gift to our own benefit! We are to use the gifts we have to help others in their lives.

At Zion Lutheran, we would love to hear from each of you about what you believe YOUR gifts are! That's what this survey is for. Then we hope you take a look at our church committees and realize that your specific gifts could be very helpful in assisting one of our committees and their responsibilities. Here are our council committees: Faith Formation (consists of education and youth), Finance and Stewardship (consists of finance, stewardship, and properties), Mission and Outreach, Welcome and Caring (consists of welcome and outreach, fellowship, and visitation), and Worship and Music.

In addition to these committees, we also have a men's group that helps out by cooking monthly meals one Sunday a month plus other helpful tasks, a women's group that helps with funerals and their meals, plus with many other helpful tasks. We have a quilting group, a card-makers group, a book discussion group, etc.

Our hope is that each of you will 1) fill out the Time & Talent questionnaire, and then 2) pull those pages out of this newsletter carefully WITH your name on it, and then 3) drop the filled out questionnaire off at the church office. We will spent some time sorting the responses and then the different committee chairs will look at them and reach out to those people who have gifts that would help our ministries!

(Yes, we continue to ask for and need your financial stewardship, but this issue we are focusing on our gifts of time and talents!)

Bombas Socks Donation

One of the Omaha churches I served as a part-time interim before moving here to Aberdeen was accepted by the Bombas company as a site to give socks away to people who need them. This company really believes in stewardship, as it is my understanding that "or ever pair they sell, they give a pair away.

Trinity Lutheran in Omaha donated over 200 pairs of Bombas socks to Zion a month ago when I was there visiting my family and friends, and these socks are now almost all distributed to our community! Since then, Zion has also applied to be a Bomba sock donation site, but we are on a long waiting list as there are many other groups who have also applied.






ORGAN TEA FUNDRAISER
