Bible Study is back!

Pastor Jim is restarting Bible study in October. Adults may attend either the Wednesday evening class with the confirmands and their parents that goes from 6:30-7:30 PM starting October 4, or join us Thursdays starting October 5 over the lunch hour from 12:00-1:00 in Classrooms A & B. Feel free to bring your own lunch, show up late and leave early if you are on a time schedule. Bring your own Bible, or use one of ours. We'll be using handouts so you can take them home after class and look at them in more detail.

Our Bible study theme is "An Introduction to the Bible" so we'll be spending the fall primarily looking at the Old Testament, starting with God's call to Abraham in Genesis 12 and continuing from there up through the prophets. There are 7 lessons I have put together on the Old Testament and another 6 lessons on the New Testament. At the end of the classes, you'll know more than you did when you started but also probably have more questions about the Bible.

Confirmation Classes start October 5

I will offer confirmation classes for any young person interested (those connected to our congregation and their friends as well!) on Wednesday evenings from 6:30-7:30 PM starting October 4. We ask that a parent or a designated adult attend classes with the youth.

Classes will be held on **Wednesday evenings from October 4 through November 15** in the fellowship hall. During these 7 sessions the topic will be "An Introduction to the Bible" and we'll be studying the Old Testament—Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Joseph, Moses, King Saul, King David, King Solomon, and the prophets Isaiah, Jeremiah, and Ezekiel. We'll learn about the Exodus from Egypt and the Ten Commandments, the struggles to live in the Promised Land, the exile to Babylon, and many other stories.

The fall semester will focus entirely on the Old Testament, so confirmands should bring their orange Spark Bible as we'll be looking at the maps in the back as well as other highlights in these Bibles. Let us know if you can't find your Bible.

Last year we put up big posters from each committee on the wall of the fellowship hall so you could have coffee, walk by and see which one(s) interested you. October is our month to collect, collate, and organize these Time & Talent sheets, so thanks again for stepping up and filling one out!






