THANK YOU from Pastor Jim!

Thanks so much for all the cards, great messages and gifts you have blessed me with as I prepare to leave Zion and the ministry we've done together. If I were asked to describe Zion now, the words I would use could be "stable" and "hopeful". This church puts its money, its time, and its many gifts and talents to work in lots of different areas with a great number of volunteers stepping up and getting involved. No matter your age or your abilities, if you are willing to help, you will be welcomed and put to work!

This has been a Spirit-filled, positive time for me these past 16 months here at Zion. I wondered what it would be like returning to my college town where I lived from the fall of 1968 through the fall of 1972; the residential areas of town haven't changed much, but there are a lot more coffee shops, casinos, and car washes!

Here are the ideas I'd suggest focusing on for the next year as Pastor Nicole transitions into her role as Pastor. 1) Re-start the "ambassadors/mentors/contact" people program that Zion had before Covid. When people express a desire to join the church, ask them if they already know a family or two here and if they do, then someone from church should ask the people they know if they would take on the role of "ambassadors/welcomers" for that first year of the new people joining the church! One idea would be that once a month the newcomer and their welcomer family would agree to attend church on the same Sunday, and then sit together during coffee and catch up—with the welcomer family also introducing them to others in the church that might like to get to know the newcomers also.

2) Take some time to now go through the "Time & Talent Questionnaires" and sort them in some way so that each committee gets the names of the people who either said they might have that gift or who want to learn more about that area. Then the council members will have the responsibility to reach out to these people who have expressed interest in their area of ministry and start a conversation with them. I don't think committee members need to commit for more than one initial year to see if they are a fit for what is being done there. The people who are reaching out to these potential new committee members need to talk about what their committee does, mention the Time & Talent sheets, and then give them some time to think about trying a committee for a while before deciding.

Please don't guilt people into agreeing to come onto a committee because we're desperate—that just doesn't work. Focus more on Informing them first, Inviting them to consider taking part second, and Including them in the group third as they are shown and guided by the veterans on the committee and shown what this group does.

That's basically my main idea for Zion for the next year. If I were still here for one more year, that's what I'd consider having us focus on, so perhaps you can just discuss this idea and see if is something workable.

I will be picking up the U-Haul truck on Saturday, December 30 and need all the help I can get to load and pack the truck on Monday, January 1 starting about 3:00 in the afternoon. If we can get everything loaded, the kitties and I will spend one final night in the house sleeping on the carpet, and then Tuesday morning, January 2, I will drive my car to the U-Haul place, catch a ride back to my house, and then put the cats into the cab with me, and drive the truck to the U-Haul place to get the car trailer attached and the car secured on it, and then head south to Wayne around 9:00 a.m. If the roads and weather cooperate I hope to arrive in Wayne, NE (about an hour SE of Yankton, SD) around 3:00 where a group from the next churches I'll be serving will help me unload. I'll have the same phone # and email and will be renting a place at 1022 Douglas in Wayne.

Thanks again for all you've done for me this last year to help support me as your pastor!
