Grace and Peace to you, beloved,

What a wonderful occasion to be writing you. What is the occasion? Any time we are able to greet the ones we value. As your pastor this means you, each of you! How does that saying go? "Without U, there is no CH_RCH." We are people working together for the glory of God. We are people baptized for the work of the gospel. What a great honor we each have, to be workers in the kingdom!

To help us with this labor, church leadership has been busy laying foundational pathways for us to celebrate our discipleship life together, fulfilling our mission to *cultivate communities of caring and belonging as champions of the gospel*.

Pathway #1: Rooted in Faith

Starting September 8, we will begin a new journey with scripture using the Narrative Lectionary. Through the sharing of biblical accounts, we will explore how God shows up both to our biblical ancestors and to us, revealing God's grace in ways we might not think to look.

Starting September 11 at 6:05 PM, we will begin "Living out Loud!," a weekly time of food, fellowship and bible study. This will be a cross generational experience. ALL ARE WELCOME. Together, we will develop our roots as a people of God, becoming more secure in our understanding of the bible, our relationship with God, and our expression as a Lutheran-flavored Christian.

Pathway #2: Growing in Spirit

Church leadership desires to help develop the "belonging" spirit here at Zion, so they are making a commitment to you. Each month, the approved minutes will be posted on the bulletin board in the fellowship hall. Come read and stay informed. They will also be routinely speaking during the Ministry Moment at the end of worship. Their goal is to bridge deeper connections with the members of Zion.

Pathway #3: Reaching Out to Those in Need

In the tradition of special offerings, we introduce to you, "Love Offerings: Compassion from the Heart, Change for the World." Each month, a unique theme will guide our stewardship practices, highlighting three aspects of giving and service: the church, our neighbors, and the world. We pray you will be inspired to connect your excitement as a disciple, caring for (stewarding) all the gifts God gives us, as an opportunity to support the mission and ministries alive here at Zion.

another. Please feel free to invite a friend, and we will see you there!




Table of Plenty


Then, from 2:00-4:30 PM, everyone is invited to gather at SkateAway for an afternoon of fun and fellowship together as a faith family.


