From the Pastor's Pen 2025.03.01

Welcome to the month of March, beloved children of God. In March, there are many events to keep our attention busy, such as Spring Break and St. Patrick's Day.

For us Lutheran-flavored Christians, our March will also be filled with the ritual of Lent. Beginning on Ash Wednesday (March 5th) our lives will carve out a 40 day experience of contemplation. Our contemplation will invite us to consider how we are tempted away from God and how we keep our focus on God when we are tempted. Jesus knows all too well what temptation is, and Jesus shows us in exemplary fashion what it means to stand firm in the face of temptation.

Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, returned from the Jordan and was led by the Spirit in the wilderness, where for forty days he was tempted by the devil. He ate nothing at all during those days, and when they were over, he was famished. The devil said to him, 'If you are the Son of God, command this stone to become a loaf of bread.' Jesus answered him, 'It is written, "One does not live by bread alone." Then the devil led him up and showed him in an instant all the kingdoms of the world. And the devil said to him, 'To you I will give their glory and all this authority; for it has been given over to me, and I give it to anyone I please. If you, then, will worship me, it will all be yours. Sesus answered him, 'It is written, "Worship the Lord your God, and serve only him." Then the devil took him to Jerusalem, and placed him on the pinnacle of the temple, saying to him, 'If you are the Son of God, throw yourself down from here, for it is written, "He will command his angels concerning you, to protect you", and "On their hands they will bear you up, so that you will not dash your foot against a stone." Less answered him, 'It is said, 'Do not put the Lord your God to the test." When the devil had finished every test, he departed from him until an opportune time. Then Jesus, filled with the power of the Spirit, returned to Galilee, and a report about him spread through all the surrounding country. He began to teach in their synagogues and was praised by everyone. (Luke 4:1-15)

What do we glean when we read scriptures such as the one above? How does knowing this account help us stand firm when we are faced with temptations that pull us away from God? St. Paul in Ephesians 6 reminds us that the sword of the Spirit, is the word of God. How do we allow the word/Word to be a tool helping us navigate the very real temptations around us?

With these questions, we step boldly into the season, being diligent to our lived identity as children of God—heirs with Christ.

What will you do to make this season a profound moment of saying "no" to that which pulls you from God and "yes" to what brings you closer? How will you find shelter under the Savior, that is, the Word of God, to rise up new for the Easter Story to affect your life, your well-being, and your legacy?

As you contemplate dwelling in the season of Lent, you might consider joining me for "Ashes to Go" on March 5^{th} . I will be available from 6:00-9:00 am in the South Parking Lot ready to pray and cross with ashes anyone who desires to begin their day marked with the strength of God to overcome the mortality of our flesh. This may be an exceptionally valuable experience for anyone who is unable to attend the traditional Ash Wed worship services at 12:15 PM and 6:05 PM.

You are also invited to support others find shelter under the love of God through this season's Expression of Faith Theme: Shelter under the Savior. Our special Love & Noisy offerings will go to the Journey Home and Lutheran Disaster Response, representing a local and a national organization that care for those during traumatic moments. As a special activity, we will be collecting tangible goods for the Salvation Army for the next six weeks.




If you are interested in applying for camp, please speak with Saundra as soon as possible so we can get you registered and discuss fundraising options. There are some camperships available, as well!



We need your talents and your time to support each other in our faith journey, fine tune our internal processes, strengthen communication and expand our service to others.

I am excited about the opportunity to work with Rev. Martin, the Church Council members and all of you during this next year.

Organ Rejuvenation Update

For those of you who were unable to attend Zion's recent annual meeting, we want to share an update with you on the progress of the organ rejuvenation capital campaign:

At a special congregational meeting held in June of 2021, the congregation approved the formation of the Organ Rejuvenation Committee with the authority to raise the funds necessary to complete the repairs set forth by the JF Nordlie company. In the time since, our committee worked diligently to try to raise the \$250,000 goal set during that meeting. After years of obtaining pledges and holding fundraisers, we were still nowhere near the \$250,000 anticipated project cost.

In late fall 2023, our committee then determined we needed to adjust our goal to a less elaborate renovation, which we estimated would be about \$180,000. When we received the bid for the less extensive renovation, it was \$200,000. Just a few months later, that bid was amended to be \$240,000. We sought outside assistance regarding this bid to try to understand the drastic increase in costs in such a short timeframe. It was then that we learned the original bids we received were not all inclusive. The original figures we had did not include sales tax and some other ancillary costs. When those additional costs are added in, the project cost for the original proposal we received should have been closer to \$300,000—\$325,000.

With this knowledge, Sonya, myself, and Pastor Nicole scheduled a meeting with the JF Nordlie company to better understand our options. During the Zoom call this past summer, we learned costs associated with our restoration are primarily for removing the pipes safely and replacing the pipes appropriately. They explained that the organ restoration is like heart surgery. You must break open the ribs, complete the necessary repairs, and put the ribs back. No restoration can happen without this procedure. They also reiterated the most recent bid we had was only good through the end of 2024. Due to scheduling, even if we had all of the funds raised and were ready to start, they wouldn't get to our project until at least mid-2026, which could again alter the costs. The committee feels like it is chasing a moving target.

When the committee reviewed the 2021 special meeting minutes where this organ project had been approved, the scope of the motion was very narrow. To abide by the scope of that motion, the committee recommended leaving the funds raised to date in the fund for organ repair until the funds are depleted, or until the repairs needed exceed the funds available.

During our 2025 annual meeting in January, our committee was granted authority to expand our scope, which allows us to research other potential repair options, instrument replacement alternatives, or alternative repairs to keep the organ working as long as possible. Our committee is ready to begin this research and bring our findings back to the congregation within the six-month time frame allotted at the meeting, but we need your feedback.

Our committee needs to understand where our congregation stands on the organ project. The committee will bring alternatives back to the congregation, and we are committed to hearing any and all ideas on this project. We urge you to please respond to the survey. Additionally, you can also reach out to the committee or send an email with your thoughts or questions. We would prefer this not to be anonymous because we need to know what each of you are thinking. If you feel our music has moved away from this instrument, concerned with the organ staying in its current state could be a potential fire hazard, concerned with the future of organ staff, do not care what instrument music comes from as long as we can praise Him together—we need to hear it all. This feedback is vital so we can move forward with what a majority of the congregation desires.

We ask that you remove the bottom portion of this paper, fill it out, and return it to the church office or place it in the offering plate on Sunday mornings by **Monday, March 31** so we have ample time to research all options.

Our committee wants to thank everyone who donated their time, talents, or funds to this project. It is because of those generous gifts that we, as a committee, want to see this project reflect our music ministry here at Zion, along with the desires of those who gave while working to understand how we can achieve that with the funds we have.

We hope to hear from you soon so we can move forward with your input.
