Consider the seasons like an ocean wave, ebbing and flowing as highs and lows both to our individual lives and as a community.

Lent is a pull upon us—the valley we must navigate with our eyes looking to the sky with hope for what comes. We hike through that valley with the shadows of Jesus and with poignant words echoing in our ears: "Repent. The kingdom of God comes near."

If you are interested in applying for camp, please speak with Saundra as soon as possible so we can get you registered and discuss fundraising options. There are some camperships available, as well!





Trust Fund Update

Good People of Zion,

There are many working parts to the healthy function of a church. While Worship, Faith Formation, Fellowship and Outreach are usually the first ministries that people think of, those ministries are possible because of the ministries we don't typically think about, like Properties and Finance & Stewardship. These "out of site, out of mind" ministry teams do a large portion of work and set up policies that give foundational support to the church. We on the Trust Fund committee believe we are part of this foundational support.

If you're not familiar with the Trust Fund, it was established in the late 1980s for the purpose of enhancing the work of the church by establishing new ministries and stewardship opportunities additional to and apart from the general operation of the congregation. (C5.05 Zion Constitution)

A Trust Fund creates space for investments from estates, properties, and sometimes individual check donations. Each donation supports the legacy endurance of Zion Lutheran Church. Biblically, think Joseph in Egypt collecting agricultural goods to be distributed for the well-being of the people. Not like Joseph, a Trust Fund is bound to certain laws in the United States in that donors contribute to the principal balance of the trust, and the Trust Fund team, with feedback from the congregation, may use the earned interest to support "new ministries and stewardship opportunities additional to and apart from the general operation."



Continuing the Joseph metaphor, if Jospeh had taken the crops donated to the Pharaoh's storehouses and grown more crops, Jospeh could have used the new crops harvest for special purposes to enhance the kingdom, while the older crops were in reserve for emergencies only. (Note: Only the congregation at a congregational meeting has the authority to spend the principal balance "reserve" and only within the boundaries of why the funds were donated.)

In these ways, as members of Zion, when you contribute to the Trust Fund, you are investing in working ministries of the church, for the missions now and in the future, additional to and apart from general operating expenses.

This year's Trust Fund team is thankful for the opportunity to serve you, as together we discuss supporting the legacy of Zion and how we are each a called to be part of the legacy.
